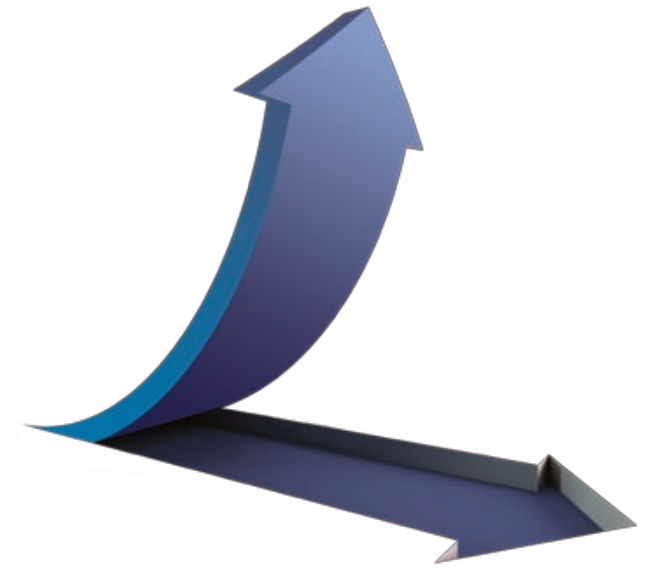

Hugh Kay Memorial Lecture. Hugh Kay was first Secretary and then Director of CABE from 1971 until his death in 1986. The Trustees of CABE decided to hold a Lecture in his memory, which has been delivered annually by eminent Christian leaders from the private, public and voluntary sectors since 1990.

CABE Principles were launched in 2006 and have been endorsed by business and church leaders including Stephen Green (Chairman, HSBC Group) who wrote "...they will act as a reminder of our Christian vocation in whatever role or field we may be working", and Lord Griffiths of Fforestfach, Vice-Chairman, Goldman Sachs and member of the Church of England whose vision is that "every Christian in the UK involved in business should have a copy. It should be the basis to better integrate faith and work."
